


# Sailfest 2005

Hello BBSC and get ready for a great racing season. We've had our practice races during the winter and now it's time to get ready to go racing. Check over your equipment, make sure the boat is in good shape, and line up your crew for the races. The first event coming up is the 2005 Sailfest sponsored by the Harbor Trading Company, the Bluewater Bay Marina and our friends at Budweiser. Charlie Mauck has volunteered to be race committee and promises an exciting event. The race activities will begin on Friday night, the 6th of May, with a registration from 6:00-7:00pm at Schooner's and a skipper's meeting at 7:00pm. Registration fee is \$25 (USSA member) and \$30 (non USSA member) and will include two Sailfest T-shirts designed by our very own Brad Davis of the Harbor Trading Company. Saturday morning, the 7th of May, will be a late registration

from 10:00-11:00 on the porch behind the store at Bluewater Bay Marina. Racing will start at approximately 12:30pm out in the bay with two classes of boats, Spinnaker and Non-spinnaker. There will be at least a couple of races with a variety of courses. Awards and a great party will follow after the race, compliments of our generous sponsors, that will start approximately 4:30-5:00pm. Trophies, food and Budweiser beer will help make the racing and stories that follow more exciting and interesting. Start planning now for the BBSC Series Race coming in June on the 18th, 19th and the 25th. There will be three days of racing with a variety of different races, windward-leeward, government mark, and a destination race. Parties associated with the racing should also be a lot of fun. This is a new format for our series races and should be easier for everyone trying to line up crew and the logistics of a multi-event series. #### SMALL BOAT SERIES #1

We had a beautiful day for racing during the 1st small boat series regatta. Winds started out about 15 kts from the South and slowly dropped to about 8-10 kts by the end of the last race. thanks go out to Mickey for setting the marks - we had a square starting line and windward leg for all 4 races - something very rare last year. Waves were small - except for the wake of the monster powerboat that ploughed through the middle of the fleet during the 1st race!

The first two races were Triangle WL Windward Finish & although there were some concerned faces over the length, it worked well and with the winds we finished each of them in about 25 minutes. The juniors sailed a Triangle course and finished a few minutes ahead of the adults. The last 2 races were slightly shortend as the wind dropped - we sailed Triangle WL with Leeward finish. The juniors shortened their course by using the start/finish pin as their Leeward mark. They finished these two races right with the adult fleet.

Mickey won the prize for most capsizes (was it 3?) - but only because Greg & I were doing Race Committee instead of racing! The race of the day was between Scott and Amanda during Race 4. All day the 2 of them were very competitive with each other and this race was no exception. As they were coming down the final leeward leg Amanda was slightly ahead of Scott, but he seemed to find just a little more speed. At about 2 boat-lengths to the finish line they were nose-to-nose & almost every second the lead changed as they approached the line, each boat just poking out so I could see the bow handle! At the finish it was a dead heat!

a small ray of hope - maybe that Megabyte drops off a little as the wind dies down? Actually I suspect the 30 minutes he spent out on the water pre-race might have given him some advantage. Zach and Chris were also very consistent, neither scoring worse than 4th in any race. Six of the 11 adult fleet sailors scored at least a 3rd in one race, so there is definitely some competitive talent out there.
