The club honored Bob and Vi Smith a








Untamed

Pandemonium lived up to its name this month. The Demings et al managed to supply three entries for this month's blooper award.

- 1) Event: Extended Cruise. Person Responsible: Bill Deming. The first night of the cruise was at the foot of the 331 bridge. The shallow (and mucky) bottom means that anchoring quite a distance from the shore. After Pandemonium's first/second/third anchoring attempt, everyone dinghyed into the Sea Bar for dinner. The dinghy ride back for the Demings was even longer since Pandemonium was now on the opposite of the Intercoastal Waterway. The dingy also ran out of gas as the mother ship was reached. Lesson: Back down on your anchor.
- 2) Event: Round the Bay. Person Responsible: Patty Deming. Having done numerous uneventful jibes on various occasions, foredeck decided that jibing the spinnaker required a new and improved method for running the genny sheet over the spinnaker pole. This improved jibing procedure took some extra time, since the genny sheet need to be untangled from the spinnaker guy and the spinnaker had to be unwrapped from the forestay. Lesson: if it ain't broke, don't fix it.
- 3) Event: Round the Bay. Person Responsible: Fred Reichstetter. Despite the fact that all the other spinnaker boats had doused their chutes, Pandemonium pressed on–beating up the bay–spinnaker flying. Fred insisted that if the chute is full, the boat must be going faster. Just as Captain Deming overruled Crew Member Reichstetter, the inevitable happened and the spinnaker parted ways. Lesson: spinnakers are for leeward legs and jibs are for windward legs.

SMALL BOAT REPORT

- Its really easy to get a laser stuck in irons in windy conditions and its really hard to do well when you get stuck in irons 2 boat lengths from the finish line
- When "they" say you shouldn't let the boom go forward
 of the mast, "they" really mean it the boat will go over in
 about 1/2 a second!

As you can see from the results below the name with the bullets is strangely familiar. John Stratton was glad for the extra wind so he could really show off the Y-Flyer's paces and Tripp Humphries made a strong showing on his sunfish!


Also want to welcome Nick Mastronardi – he picked a wild day to come out and try the sunfish again – I think he sailed with us
