After the racing WE WILL HAVE DRINKS AND SNACKS PROVIDED BY THE CLUB. Schooners will be having their SHRIMP BOIL and we will have grills available for those that want to grill something. I'll bring my computer and work out the results on the porch – so come on out for some great racing & stay afterwards for a fun party.

BBSC 4 & 5 both had some pretty exciting and close racing.

For #4 the weather started off looking promising, with some big thunderheads skirting to the north, but blue skies to the south and west. Then about the time the 1st boats left the boat ramp the clouds began closing in to the west.

Three intrepid (can you say stupid maybe?) boats made it out to the island, joining our stellar RC - Zach & Tripp. We watched it get darker and watched the lightning and rain from under the tent (after we moved it back from the beach).

By 2:00 the storm had passed through and RC said "go race" so we did! The winds were pretty light and there were plenty of holes to fall into, especially around the reaching mark. As you can see from the results, Craig in the Holder had a good day in the light airs, also John did very well in the last race - he just took off and never looked back.

BBSC #5 had beautiful weather! The winds were light to moderate – with only one stretch that forced me to hike harder & longer than I could hold it! We had some exciting close finishes. Scott, Zach and John really battled for the top places, with a very slight edge going to Zach.

If you look at the High-Point results so far, you will see that of those who have participated in at least 3 of the 5 regattas, Mark Hunter has a commanding lead, with Scott, Zach & John only 2 percentage points apart in their battle for 2^{nd} - 4^{th} . We'll stop there rather than going on to the inevitable pointing out who is in last place!
