

SAILFEST 2008

This year's Sailfest. Was a great success with 11 boats in the Spinnaker fleet and 8 boats in the Non-Spinnaker fleet. Six of these boats came over from the Fort Walton Yacht Club to participate. The weather cooperated with clear skies and winds in the 12 to 17 knot range. The Race Committee consisting of Tom & Lynne Whittemore, Marilyn Ostrominski, and Doris Deming ran the regatta from Whit's End with separate courses for the two fleets. The Spinnaker Class had two races over a course consisting of two windward and two leeward legs of 1.5 miles each. The Non-Spinnaker Class course was 13.5 miles around government marks.



In the first Spinnaker race, Brian Harrison on My Dixie Wreck finished first, followed by David Eammes on Lightning Rod.

Mickey Duvall on Kahlua 12 seconds behind Lightning Rod and Jeff Brown on Amigo just nine seconds behind Kahlua. In the second race Brian Harrison took first again followed by Jennifer Grant on Breakaway, Jeff Brown on Amigo third and Mickey Duvall fourth. There was a three way tie for second place with the tie breaker determined by the finishing position in the second race. The final results had Brian Harrison in first place with two bullets followed by Breakaway in second, Amigo third, and Kahlua fourth.

The Non-Spinnaker fleet had equally tight race with Don Gresko edging out Ridge Nye by two seconds in corrected time to take first place. Third place went to Dave Lauderbaugh on Vixen.





Three BBSC cruisers sailed east on a broad reach in calm seas to the first raftup at the 331 bridge, Donna and Bill Nowak on Priority III, Kathy and Pete Hodges on Island Time, and Doris, Bill and Patty Deming on Pandemonium. Happy hour was held aboard Priority before breaking up to our anchorages for an early start through the ditch to the Shell Island destination. Beach day was picture perfect weatherwise with a cool breeze and a lots of sun. Inviting as the gulf water was, everyone was well aware of a shark cruising back and forth. Shelling was a little sparse, though. In fact Donna found her best shell in the parking lot at Pt. St. Joe. An added bonus this day was a reunion with Tom and Judy Pendegrast on their new catamaran cruiser. They were avid members of BBSC a few years back before they moved to Panama City and we reminisced some past cruises. Then on to our furthest point east. It was a wild 28-mile ride with 2-4 foot quartering seas. Kathy Hodges was the only malde-mer casualty. We all enjoyed two restaurant meals at Pt. St. Joe plus some shopping. 





