

Nine racers competed in this year's Sailfest, 5 Spinnaker and 4 Non-Spinnaker. The weather was near perfect with clear skies and Southeast winds in the 4 to 12 knot range. The Race Committee consisting of Tom & Lynne Whittemore, and Doris Deming ran the regatta from Whit's End with separate courses for the two fleets. The Spinnaker Class had two races over a course consisting of one windward and one leeward leg of 3 miles each. The Non-Spinnaker Class course was 10.5 miles around government marks.

In the first Spinnaker race David Eammes on Lightning Rod finished first followed by Pat Ballasch on Avocet ,Chad Knaepple on Head High, Bill Deming on Pandemonium and Mickey Duvall on Kahlua. In the second race Lightning Rod took first again followed by Kahlua, then Head High, Pandemonium and Avocet. There was a two way tie for third place between Kahlua and Avocet with the tie breaker determined by the finishing position in the second race. The final results had David Eammes in first place with two bullets followed by Chad Knaepple in second, Mickey Duvall third, Pat Ballasch fourth and Bill Deming last.

In the Non-Spinnaker fleet Dave Lauderbaugh on Vixen took first place honors followed by Denis Duhaine on Victoria, Bill Kaunzinger on Gemeaux in third and Michael Phillips on Kayla in fourth.

This race also counted as race 2 for those boats participating in the Series Races. The standings in the Series are:

The second small boat regatta went off without too much of a hitch. The wind was a fresh 15-20 kts which led to some guick rides from the windward mark to the gybe mark. The starts were close (but not obnoxious) with at least one successful port tack start to cross ahead of the fleet on starboard (Zack Kastl took advantage of the complacency of the fleet, saw the port tack advantage and took it). There were a couple of close portstarboard encounters on the windward legs but fortunately no equipment ended up worse for wear. By the last race Zack's boat had taken on quite a bit of water but he did make it back to the ramp, more or less dry. All in all, it was a competitive event but needed more boats.

I want to thank Charlie Mauck and crew for a well-run event. We had a small turnout due to the threat of rain (though it never did). Speaking of weather forecasts, when it comes to rain around here, the forecasts seem to me to be batting quite a bit less than .500. In fact, until I actually see rain coming down, experience has made me a doubting Thomas with regard to believing the national weather service. So, what am I saying? Don't be discouraged by weather forecasts, come on out to race. If the weather, under direct observation, appears to be tanking, we'll make the call then.

Lastly, we need more boats on the coarse. I realize that everyone has events going on during the year that conflict with our stated schedule. So, I am proposing to try to become more flexible with regard to schedules in order to find dates in which more folks can race. I would like folks who plan on racing small boats to send me their phone numbers so that I can contact them directly in order to work out makeup event dates as required.


