







#### **Bridge Members Present:**

Prior to the meeting, all BBSC members present enjoyed the heavy hors d'ouvres (meatballs, chicken wings, vegetable dip, dessert) prepared by the Marina restaurant.

### Call to order at 6:51 PM

Commodore Mickey Duvall welcomed everyone to the meeting, and introduced each bridge member by name.

Secretary's Report (Scott Pursell): Since the minutes of the Fall Banquet (11/14/09) had been printed in the January 2010 Newsletter, a motion was quickly made, seconded, and approved to accept the minutes on that basis.

Treasurer's Report (Marilyn Ostrominski): Marilyn reported a checking account balance of \$2,700 plus our \$4,000 CD currently earning 1% interest and maturing September 2010. Paid membership stands at 36 families. Also a reminder that BBSC members get a 50% discount on Boat US membership dues

Rear Commodore Charlie Mauck presented his active cruising program for the upcoming season: The Friday night raft-up April 2nd will be near Mickey Duvall's dock; on April 30th will be near Giusseppi's Wharf. The first overnight cruise will be the C.R.A.P. cruise to FWYC. The fees for that are \$10 per boat plus \$10 per crew member; \$50 minimum per boat. The deadline for reservations is March 31st. The extended cruise will be May 22 through May 30. There was some discussion on which direction to go, deciding on probably east. Charlie wants to do the Blue Blazer bash again this year. The Shrimp Boil will again be at Mickey Duvall's, on July 31st. The theme: Parrot Head. Also don't forget the July 4th party at the Demings.

Commodore Mickey Duvall presented Charlie Mauck with the Past Commodore's flag.

Fleet Captain Neville Edenborough announced that (1) what in previous years had been the series races will no longer be held as a series; they will now be held as individual races, and (2) this season we will have more emphasis on including a cruiser class in each race, in addition to the spinnaker and non-spin classes. A highlight of Neville's presentation was his very well-made chart showing the season race schedule. Neville also managed to get commitments for race committee for all but three of the season's races.

Small Boats Captain Zack Kastl announced there will be seven small boat races this year, and that none of them conflict with the FWBYC schedule. The races will be the same format as last year, and he does need volunteers for race committee. Zack also mentioned that the two ECSA 420's here at the Marina are for use by the High School sailing only. There was then some general discussion about what exactly gualifies a boat as a "small boat".

Mickey Duvall made an announcement that BBSC member Bill Nowack had very recently had a heart attack and was in critical care at Sacred Heart.

The 50-50 cash drawing was held by Patty Deming, in Lou Kaunzinger's absence. The winning number was held by Pete Hodges, who donated the \$90 winnings to the BBSC.

Commodore Mickey Duvall concluded the meeting reminding everyone of the upcoming Start Palooza the following Saturday.

The following week we had the Start Palooza planned to help everyone practice their starting skills but due to lack of participation it was cancelled. We did, however have a discussion on some of the new sailing rules. It never hurts to study them and understand how they apply on the course. My lesson learned is that I need to be more careful and I can't do all the things that I use to twenty years ago. I was pretty sore during the race and luckily I had a crew that all stepped up and did most everything on the boat. Be safe and see you on the water.
