## March 2, 2012

Prior to the meeting, all those present enjoyed a social half-hour that included beer, chips and salsa. It should also be mentioned that the turnout for the meeting was very good this year, with standing room only. Also, a vote of thanks is due Ryan Hinely for his work in setting up the meeting.

### Call to order at 6:26 PM

Commodore Mickey Duvall welcomed everyone to the meeting, and introduced the bridge members and several new club members. He recapped the planned race schedule and mentioned the upcoming cruises. He also announced that this year's Shrimp Boil, which he is again hosting, will also be his retirement party.

Secretary's Report (Scott Pursell): Since the minutes of the Fall Banquet (11/19/11) had been printed in the January/February 2012 Newsletter, a motion was quickly made, seconded, and approved to accept the minutes on that basis.

Treasurer's Report (Marilyn Ostrominski): Marilyn reported a checking account balance of \$3,720.70 plus our \$4,000 CD. Marilyn stated that since last year the best interest rate for CDs is so low that they are not currently worth the effort. Paid membership stands at 55 as of tonight. She named Craig Wilusz who is sponsoring Sailfest (again) this year, and David Vaughn and Bill and Gisela Redinger for donations made to the BBSC. Also a reminder that BBSC members get a 50% discount on Boat US membership dues. Mickey Duvall spoke up with the names of our additional sponsors: Walt Ruckel, Dave Lauderbaugh, Dennis Mayhew, Brian Gwinnup, and Marina Cove Realty.

Rear Commodore Charlie Mauck announced this year's upcoming cruise events: The raft-up outside Baytown Marina March 31<sup>st</sup> and April 1<sup>st</sup>, the Shrimp Boil / Mickey's retirement party April 28<sup>th</sup>, the Extended Cruise which will be headed west this year April 19<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup>, the cruise to marker



50 later this summer, the Pirate Party sometime in August, the Marina circle raft-up in September, and the BBSC Fall Banquet November 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Small Boats Captain Mark Hunter announced that this year there will be 6 small boat races, plus one day scheduled for backup. He also described small boat racing as a good "low-key" way to get into racing, and mentioned that our races are a mixture of kids and adults. One of the members asked if small boats are available for use, which led to some general discussion on the matter. Mark said that he will look into that. Mark also mentioned that the schedule is posted on the BBSC website, and that he needs volunteers for race committee. The first small boat race is April 22<sup>nd</sup>, and they will be monthly through October. Mickey Duvall took this moment to present the Chili Dog race perpetual winner trophy to Mark for winning the Chili Dog race this year.

Fleet Captain (Joan McCarthy, in Neville Edenborough's absence) went over this year's race schedule, beginning with the Spring Regatta on March 24<sup>th</sup>, and mentioned that we need volunteers for race committee.

Commodore Mickey Duvall at this time opened the floor for discussion. Zack Kastl asked that any families with high school kids see him or Mark Hunter. Toni Phillips asked if there was any way for people who want to race but don't own boats to participate. Mickey mentioned that crewing in the Wednesday night races is a good fun way to get started, and encouraged

all skippers who race their boats on Wednesday nights to try to bring along as many people as they can who want to sail. Fred Reichstetter suggested that people who are available to crew be encouraged to list their names on the BBSC website. This led to some general discussion on the matter. Mickey then reminded everyone that we need volunteers for race committee. Mike Phillips then asked if there were any plans to replace the Cobb's Club mark. Mickey said that the bridge "needs to talk about it". The meeting adjourned at 7:10 PM.

Note: After the meeting adjourned, Patty Duvall assisted Joan McCarthy in encouraging individual members to sign up for race committee, successfully getting commitments for nearly all upcoming races.
