Hello Sailors. This year we're going to make a few changes to the norm. First, we're going to have a series of five races in which the sail configurations will be restricted. We'll all race Jib and Main (JAM) only. The word jib is a little too restrictive as genoas are allowed. However, no spinnakers, gennakers or other

novel or specialty sails will be permitted. Staysails and mizzens are permitted on boats for which they are normally fitted. There will be an A and B fleet. The division will be made based on PHRF handicap. The actual PHRF value of the break point will be made upon review of the entries. The second change from the norm is the focus on racing in the winter and spring rather that the summer. The JAM races will take place starting in January through early March with the last JAM race in early December. The focus on earlier sailing and easier crew duties will hopefully bring a new flavor to some of our racing.

Another change this year is the an additional *Round the Bay* race. Traditionally, we've sailed out of Rocky Bayou through the Mid-bay Bridge going east to Freeport and back. This year, we'll still have that form of *Round the Bay* but we'll also have a sister race in which we'll go west. That way, when you take both races into account, we'll have truly sailed around the Choctawhatchee Bay.

We will still use the traditional Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker classes for regattas such as *Sailfest*, *Grand Finale*, *Pick Your Poison*, *Challenge Cup*, and the *Round the Bay* races.

I am looking for volunteers to help with committee duty for these events and feedback on this new format and schedule. I hope to see you on the water.
