Diamond recognized the delayed start but after last weeks editorial comments they opted to not clog the line and not get close to other competitors.

The race out to the mark was a good duel with at least five boats rather close to the turning mark by the time Stickman did their two required performance turns and round ahead of all others. They now have 3 first place turning mark victories and are required to do one "Mark Hunter" rule for the start.

The leg home was a nice romp with a quartering wind to a beam reach. Push It Up slid to a first place finish after they did their 1 required performance turn.



The first phase of the race was the close reach to the midbay bridge. The second phase was the long broad reach to Freeport. Several boats were hitting alltime fastest speeds on the sleigh ride east. Phase three was the beat back to the west which wasn't much fun for any boat. The smaller boats pounded through the chop setup by the mostly steady wind. In the end, Shenanigan (spin), Kahlua (non-spin) and Marcy (cruiser) took first for each class.

As is usual for our Bermuda starts, we also publish the start statistics for all the boats. Below we've noted the difference between the stated start time for each boat and their actual start times. In general, all the boats did a great job crossing the line soon after their start.
