Wednesday Night Fun Race Series - Sponsored by L.J. Schooners Oyster Bar. Attached are the 2020 rules. I may not be able to be in attendance on Wednesday. If not, Tom McNally will be race committee on PANACEA.

It is time - finally - to start our glorious

Performance 360 rule – Weekly posted participation and sailing instructions will be posted showing how many 360 each vessel be required to perform before rounding the turn mark or before finishing.

On the return leg all 360 turns must be completed between Rocky 1 and the finish line.

#### Schedule

- · April through September
- Course, participation and sailing instructions posted in Oyster Bar nlt 5:00 pm every Wednesday
- 1st Flag 5:55 pm (approximate)
- Start 6:00 pm (approximate)
- Turnaround 6:45 pm if no vessel has rounded designated turning mark
- Awards 7:45 pm at Oyster Bar

#### Rules

- This is BOAT race. Scoring is given to the vessel not the skipper.
- Race Committee will use standard 5 min sequence and have the option of anchoring for a conventional start or station/ hover their vessel at the West end of the start line to monitor the start.
  - Only the main and mizzen can be hoisted while performing race committee duties
  - Engine must be on to maintain position to monitor the line
  - Once line is cleared race committee can hoist remaining sails and join the fleet (If a vessel is over early then the individual recall flag will be flown and any other attempts e.g. horn, radio to announce over early. Race committee can join the race once the over early vessel has cleared the line or they have disqualified the offending vessel)
- Turning mark to be rounded to Port unless sailing instructions dictate otherwise
- BBSC "Performance 360" rule in effect
- Additional "Mark Hunter 5.0" rule in effect for high performing vessels

#### In addition (Mark Hunter 5.0):

- If you receive 2 first to the turning mark wins then your start will be delayed by 4 min.
- If you receive 3 first to the turning mark wins then your start will be delayed by 5 min.
- If you receive 4 first to the turning mark wins then your start will be delayed by 7 min.
- If you receive 5 first to the turning mark wins then your start will be delayed by 9 min.
- If you receive 6 first to the turning mark wins then your start will be delayed by 12 min.
- If you receive more than 6 first to the turning mark then you came claim victory over the entire fleet and stake your claim as the best sailor on the bay.

Awards – 7:45 pm at Oyster Bar. Awards will be given to first to mark and first to finish and maybe something else as well.

#### **Points**

- Participation 1 point
- Race Committee 1 points (Maximum of 5 points per season)
- 1st to turning mark 2 points
- 1st to Finish 2 points (Applies only if finish places are taken and start/finish mark(s) are brought in and stored)
- Any boat which is first to Boggy AND first to Finish will get an additional 1 point
- Style points (+1 or -1): Up to race committee discretion Communication – We will attempt to send out email recap / standings / and reminder every week. No guarantees.


