Sailor of the Year standings

The Sailor-Of-The-Year is to be awarded based on performance and participation in the annual BBSC racing program throughout the year. Sailors have accumulated points based on the finish position of the boat on which they were sailing for a given event. All BBSC members are eligible, whether sailing as skipper or crew, and sailors must perform Race Committee duties for a BBSC sponsored event at least once during the year to qualify. (Wet Wednesdays are not included.)

The slate of seven PHRF races has been completed, the best five of which count in the scoring. Seven of the eight small boat races have been sailed, with the eighth being sailed on Black Friday, Nov 27th. The best six of the eight small boat races count in the scoring.

GYA 'Enhanced' PHRF rating certificates:

Beginning in January, GYA-PHRF will roll-out an 'enhanced' PHRF rating system utilizing new ratings based on the Offshore Racing Association's velocity prediction program.

- If you have a valid GYA PHRF certificate, you will receive your new rating certificate in the mail. You need only pay the pro-rated invoice to GYA.
- If you don't currently have valid GYA rating certificate, you need to apply as soon as possible by completing the application form found on GYA-PHRF.com (or GYA.org/phrf).

The new certificate will have spinnaker and non-spinnaker ratings, for w/l course and random leg course, and for light winds and medium winds. I think the ratings will be something like this:
